Facilities

Almost all academic activities will take place in different rooms of the Constitución 1812 Building, known as "La Bomba" (Paseo de Carlos III, 3). This is just 4 minutes from the Colegio Mayor. In the case of the flows, two of them will be in the same Constitución 1812 Building, another one will be in the Assembly Hall of the Colegio Mayor, and the last one will be in the Hospital Real Building (Plaza del Falla, 8), which is also 3 minutes from the Colegio Mayor.

Accommodation

All the rooms in the Colegio Mayor (Avenida Doctor Gómez Ulla, 22) have a private bathroom, hot and cold air conditioning, minibar and safe. And the Colegio Mayor has numerous common facilities, such as coin-operated laundry service, bicycle parking, library, gym, sports court, leisure room, etc. Feel free to use them!

Meals



Weather

It is being a hot summer throughout Europe, but at least Andalusia is used to it. In addition, Cádiz is completely surrounded by the coast (in the strict sense it is an island), so its temperatures are milder than in other parts of Andalusia and Spain. Remember to bring fresh clothes and drink lots of water!



Some suggestions to have dinner

- Restaurante Destino. c/ San Fernando, 4. Cozy restaurant placed in the main square of Cádiz.
- Freiduría Las Flores. Plaza Topete, 4. Generous portions of seafood or fried fish in paper or on a tray in a humble brewery with a terrace.
- La Veganesa. c/ San Antonio Abad, nº 5. A small and cozy vegetarian/vegan restaurant.
- Fogón de Mariana. c/ Antulo, 2. Traditional cuisine restaurant. Dishes made with products from Cádiz, especially meat.
- Central Market. Plaza de la Libertad. In addition to the sales area, it has a gastronomic area, with abundant food options (with some vegan places too). A truly Cadiz experience.

Some suggestions to have a drink

- Café de Levante. c/ Rosario, 35. Teas, drinks and cocktails in an intimate tavern decorated with artist photographs. A classic in Cádiz.
- Woodstock. c/ Sagasta, s/n. Wide variety of beers in a lively pub with a rock atmosphere.
- Rollin'Rock Pub. c/ Isabel la Católica, 1. A small and cozy rock pub with good beer, music and atmosphere.
- LaColonial Alameda Cocktail Bar. Alameda Apodaca, 15D. A cool cocktail bar in a really beautiful place.
- O'Connell's. Pl. de San Francisco. A classic irish pub.
- Chupitería. Many types of shots, cocktails and beers, with billiards and table football.
- Evohé. c/ Beato Diego de Cádiz, 8. Café and cocktail bar decorated with African airs, dim lighting, music and a young atmosphere.
